Contemporary Book Group Happenings!

In September, the book selection for our Contemporary Book Group was "The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store" by James McBride. This novel is set in the diverse 1930s Chicken Hill neighborhood of Pottstown, Pennsylvania. The plot involves the community banding together to protect a deaf black boy from being institutionalized in the Pennhurst State School and Hospital, originally known as the Eastern Pennsylvania State Institution for the Feeble-Minded and Epileptic. Pennhurst was a state run institution for mentally and physically disabled individuals. After 79 years of controversy, mainly because of widespread patient abuse, Pennhurst was closed in 1987.


Much of the group discussion about this book centered around the way disabled individuals were treated during the time when institutions like Pennhurst existed compared to how they are treated today.

Based on that discussion, some members of our group visited Lark Enterprises located on Route 65 in Shenango Township, where people with disabilities are given employment opportunities. There we met with

the Director, Susan Lautenbacher, and were given a tour of the facility and observed clients producing safety apparel for Penn-DOT among other screen printing and embroidering projects. Clients are treated with dignity and respect and are paid at least

minimum wage for their work. Lark clients also provide janitorial services for many local businesses and many are employed in businesses throughout Lawrence County. They can now lead happy, productive lives as con-

tributing members of our communities.
