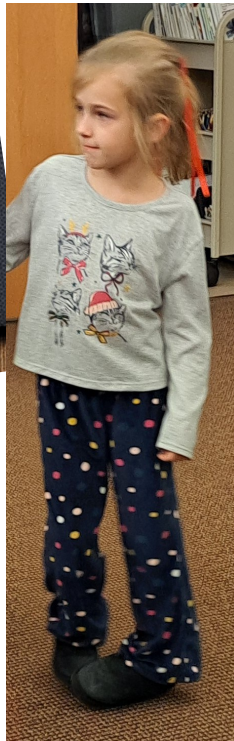
# Santa Visited Us Just Before Christmas!

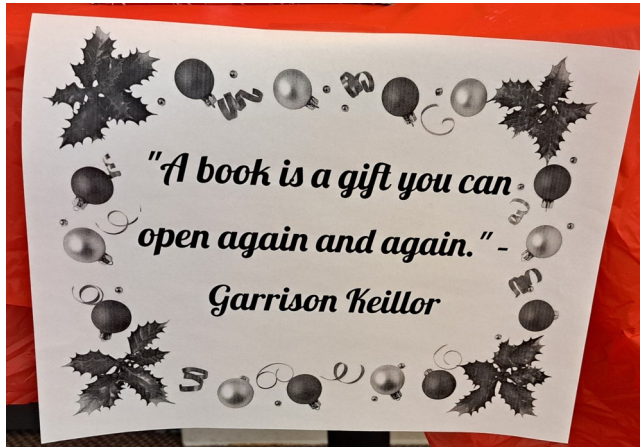
